Please make sure you listen to your child read and that their diaries are signed and books are returned by Wednesday the following week to be changed.
PE	Bags and Belongings	Reading and Maths lesson changes
PE days are Mondays and Tuesdays. Children should have both an indoor (shorts, t- shirt) and outdoor (leggings/joggers, sweatshirt) in school as well as suitable footwear (pumps/trainers). Please make sure all items are clearly labelled.	Children should come into school every morning with a suitable outdoor coat, water bottle and a packed lunch (if applicable) Please ensure ALL items of clothing/belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name and class.	In Year 5, children are mixed up for Reading and Maths lessons. This is to ensure lessons can be tailored to the needs of children and so they can be appropriately challenged or supported where needed. This means that your child may not necessarily be taught by their class teacher for Reading and/or Maths, they may be taught by the other Year 5 teacher. We have found this to be very successful in previous years. Classes will remain together for all other lessons.
