Here is some information regarding phonic phases and some good games for your child to play on the Ipad.

Phonic Phases:

Each year group in the infants concentrates on a Phonic Phase. These build on each other every year.

Phase 1: All children start with Phase 1 and this is taught in Nursery - this phase concentrates on environmental sounds, orally sounding out skills, rhyme and alliteration.

Phase 2: The first set of sounds are introduced in Reception with the skills to begin to sound out simple words to read and spell.

Phase 3: Taught in Reception. This phase continues to introduce the rest of the letters in the alphabet and then the digraphs (2 letters that make 1 sound, eg ch in chip.)

Phase 4: This is taught in Reception and revised in Year 1. This phase looks at longer words with constant clusters.

Phase 5: Taught in Year 1 and revised in Year 2. Phase 5 introduces alternative digraphs, spellings and pronunciations.

Phase 6: Taught in Year 2 - this phase looks at spelling patterns (eg'ed' in look<u>ed</u>; 'ing' in start<u>ing;</u> 'un' in <u>un</u>true etc)

Please don't be tempted to skip ahead to the next year group's phonic phase. The children need to really embed the phase for their year group before they move on.

Year 2: Phase 5 revision




Don't be tempted to skip ahead to the next year group's phases. The children need to really embed the phase from their year group first. If you have any questions regarding this please speak to me!
